Bike Safety

On Wednesday, students in Years 4 & 5 went on an excursion to CARES (Community And Road Education Scheme) at St Ives. Two policewomen took us through some important road safety requirements we need to learn before we can ride our bikes on the road. After all, it could save our lives! At CARES there is a replicated version of actual traffic zones. While riding, we needed to watch for pedestrians, obey traffic signs and lights, keep to the left side of the road, slow down when approaching intersections, indicate while riding and of course always wear a properly fitted helmet.

In the video sessions we learned about the correct things a bike needs before it is roadworthy and that our brains are like jelly so we need to protect them from hard things like trees and trucks!

Everyone needs to be safe on the roads but things can accidentally go wrong. There are a lot of things to think about. It was good to have this opportunity so that we will be able to apply it in the real world.
